

## OTNA May 16, 2007 Meeting Minutes - at the Bartlett Center, Torrance

Welcome and meeting called to order at 7:31 p.m. Co-Presidents Todd Hays and Charles Payne thanked everyone for attending and introduced OTNA's other officers, Ida Petrucelli, V.P., Trish Stewart, Treasurer, Paul McCabe, Secretary, and Debbie Hays, Immediate Past President.

V.P. Ida Petrucelli needs assistance and it was asked to please volunteer to assist her in delivering flyers. Trish Stewart, Treasurer advised OTNA has about \$1,300.00 in the bank.

Todd updated everyone on the Sun-Cal / Del Amo property meetings. He indicated that the process was moving slowly and that the owner would have an update for the community soon.

Charles, as a member of the City's Blue Ribbon Ethics Committee, reported that a recommendation would be made to the Mayor and City Council later this year.

Motion by Ida Petrucelli and seconded by Dayna Berman to donate \$100.00 to Switzer Center. Passed.

Military displays will be at the Del Amo Fashion Center parking lot near the Acapulco Restaurant, Friday and Saturday 10:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. and Sunday 1:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. The parade starts at 1:30 p.m. Saturday along Torrance Blvd. from Crenshaw to Madrona.
